

# 2020 ANNUAL REPORT

A network of food pantries building ladders of peace to nourish the body, mind, and soul....



In response to the evolving needs of our community during the pandemic, in 2020 Friedens continually innovated operations. This was possible with the support and dedication of our long-time volunteer Peace Builders, totaling over 800 individuals - 30% of whom reside in the neighboring community - logging over 13,000 volunteer hours.

In 2020, we provided 750,000 pounds of fresh and nutritious food options, over 140,000 pounds of which was rescued from local grocery stores. We served more than 36,000 individuals and 13,000 households. This past year, we introduced two hydroponic greenhouse towers to grow food yearround.







Friedens is both resilient and innovative. In 2021-2022, Friedens is hoping to incorporate free grocery delivery into its emergency food program to reach more clients in need. Additionally, in order to best support our transition towards a community food center, we have added staff to our team. An Operations Manager and Food Center Coordinator will be focused on creating equitable and efficient supply and distribution networks, expanding programs and resources that increase food literacy, and connecting clients to other supportive services. While it is our hope that we no longer exist in another 40 years due to increased food security, we must work hard today to ensure that our doors are open to meet tomorrow's need.
